RESEARCH INTERESTS: Plant pathogens are very diverse and for a plant pathologist, it is crucial to have knowledge on how to differentiate different pathogens causing different diseases. This is the reason why Zannah is in love with plant diseases and their causative pathogens because by understanding the pathogens' mechanisms of overcoming the resistance in crops, Zannah is in a position to come up with feasible management strategies for different diseases.

Zannah's proposed research at the University of Minnesota is to characterize resistance in wheat crop to Fusarium Head Blight and Stem Rust diseases. In Kenya, her research will also focus on race pathotyping of stem rust isolates.

PERSONAL STATEMENT: Zannah's future goal is to use her knowledge and experiences she has gained from the University of Minnesota to alleviate poverty in Kenya by working with research scientists in KALRO and/or agricultural research focused universities. Zannah will actively participate in screening for resistance against stem rust and Fusarium Head Blight diseases either in the greenhouse, field or use of molecular markers. The goal is to have resistant wheat varieties to both stem rust and Fusarium Head Blight released to farmers.
