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### **RULES OF GOOD HORSEMANSHIP**

- 1. APPROACH, MOUNT, DISMOUNT AND LEAD FROM THE LEFT SIDE OF THE HORSE/PONY.
- 2. KEEP HANDS AND VOICE SOFT AND QUIET, NO LOUD VOICE OR JERKING OF REINS, WHEN RIDING, ANNOUNCE YOUR PRESENCE TO THE HORSE/PONY BY TALKING AND TOUCHING THEM FIRMLY, SO AS NOT TO STARTLE THEM.
- 3. DO NOT MAKE SUDDEN LOUD SOUNDS OR QUICK MOVEMENTS AROUND A NEW HORSE.
- 4. PET THE HORSE/PONY ON THE SHOULDER OR THE NECK. THEY CAN'T SEE YOU IF YOU STAND RIGHT IN FRONT OF THEM.
- 5. SIT IN THE CORRECT POSITION FOR THE STYLE OF RIDING YOU ARE DOING
- 6. KEEP THE PROPER TENSION ON THE REINS- NOT TOO LOOSE OR TOO TIGHT.
- 7. ALWAYS WEAR PROPERLY FITTED HEAD GEAR, BOOTS AND LONG PANTS WHEN WORKING WITH HORSES/PONIES
- 8.KEEP TACK CLEAN, DRY AND IN GOOD REPAIR. CHECK IT BEFORE EACH RIDE TO BE SURE IT IS SAFE AND IN GOOD CONDITION.
- 9. CLEAN BITS AND OTHER SOILED TACK AFTER EACH RIDE.
- 10. WARM UP AND COOL DOWN THE HORSE/PONY SLOWLY AND CORRECTLY FOR THE TIME OF YEAR, WHEN RIDING
- 11. IF HORSE/PONY REARS UP LEAN FORWARD AND LOOSEN THE REINS.
- 12. IF HORSE/PONY BUCKS KEEP THE REINS AND THEIR HEAD UP AND LEAN BACK, WITH YOUR LEGS DOWN LONG. DO NOT DRAW UP YOUR KNEES UP. YOU WILL FALL OFF.
- 13. LOOSEN REINS AND URGE HORSE/PONY FORWARD WITH LEGS IF HORSE/PONY BACKS UP WHEN NOT ASKED.
- 14. NEVER LOOSE YOUR TEMPER WITH A HORSE/PONY. IF THINGS ARE NOT GOING RIGHT, ASK THE HORSE TO DO SOMETHING YOU KNOW THEY CAN DO, THEN QUIT. ALWAYS STOP ON A POSITIVE NOTE. AN ANGRY PERSON CAN MAKE AN ANGRY HORSE/PONY. BE KIND AND PATIENT.
- 15. DO NOT ALLOW YOUR HORSE TO DRINK MORE THEN A <u>LITTLE SIP</u> OF WATER AFTER HARD WORK WHEN THEY ARE STILL HOT. THEY MUST BE COOLED OUT COMPLETELY TO DRINK ERFELY.
- 16. DO NOT RUN YOUR HORSE/PONY AWAY FORM OR TO THE BARN, ALWAYS WALK. THIS WILL PREVENT A BARN SOUR RUN AWAY HORSE/PONY.
- 17.IF A RIDER IS THROWN OFF OR FALLS OFF THEIR HORSE/PONY, <u>STOP</u> YOUR HORSE/PONY IMMEDIATELY AND KEEP THEM QUIET UNTIL THE LOOSE HORSE/PONY IS CAUGHT AND THE FALLEN RIDER IS SAFE.
- 18.KEEP ABOUT 5 FEET BETWEEN YOU AND ANOTHER HORSE AT YOUR SIDE, KEEP AT LEAST A FULL HORSE'S/PONY'S LENGTH BETWEEN YOU AND THE HORSE/PONY IN FRONT OF YOU.
- 19. IF PASSING ANOTHER HORSE/PONY, GOING THE SAME DIRECTION, LEAVE PLENTY OF ROOM IN FRONT OF THAT HORSE/PONY BEFORE GOING BACK IN FRONT OF THEM. **DO NOT** CUT THEM OFF SHORT. YOU COULD CAUSE AN ACCIDENT. THIS IS ESPECIALLY TRUE IN THE SHOW RING. BE COURTEOUS.
- 20. NEVER CANTER OR GALLOP YOUR HORSE/PONY UP TO ANOTHER HORSE/PONY OR GROUP OF HORSES/PONIES. YOU COULD STARTLE THEM AND CAUSE AN ACCIDENT.
- 21. WAIT QUIETLY, WHEN IN A GROUP OF RIDERS, IF ONE RIDER HAS TO DISMOUNT AND THEN REMOUNT.
- 22. BE FIRM WITH YOUR HORSE TO MAKE THEM OBEY, BUT DO NOT JERK ON THEM OR HIT THEM.
- 23. ALWAYS BE KIND, GENTLE AND QUICK TO GIVE PRAISE AND REWARDS, WITH YOUR VOICE, AND A GENTLE RUB ON THE NECK WHEN MOUNTED AND A TREAT FROM YOUR HAND CAN BE ADDED TO THAT AFTER YOU HAVE DISMOUNTED.
- 24. HORSE/PONY PEOPLE SHOULD ALWAYS PRACTICE SAFETY AND SHOW CONSIDERATION AND KINDNESS TO OTHER RIDERS AND THE HORSES.

### Requirements

Why keep records? Properly kept records are a vital part of horse/pony ownership. Records give a clear picture of what you have invested in the project. Records also provide you with accurate facts about your horse/pony project.

### Required elements of the Horse Project Feed Record Book.

- \*\*A picture of your project horse/pony. The picture must clearly show a full body view of the horse/pony.
- \*\* Description of your project horse/pony using proper terminology to describe color and markings. Describe plans for the project area.
- \*\* Records book begins on September 1st of the current 4-H year. Exception to this must be clearly documented in the record book. Exceptions include, but are not limited to, purchase or lease of project horse/pony after September, new member joining the club after the start of the 4-H year, etc. Record books shall closed the day prior to Fair judging.
- \*\* Feed and Care recording type of and expenses
- \*\*Time Spend feeding and caring for the year.
- \*\*Project inventory sheet(s)
- \*\* Records of Health Care. Copy of Coggins.
- \*\* Copy of May 1st Horse/Pony Project Registration Certificate.
- \*\*Records of Miscellaneous Expenses and Income.
- \*\*Project summary questions.
- \*\*Project Financial Summary
- \*\*Show/Event records if exhibit in shows
- \*\*4-H member may include other information about their project horse/pony and should be placed at the end of the Horse/Pony Feed Record Book
- \*\*Horse/Pony Feed Record Book pages are in the same order of Judging Score Sheet.
- \*\* The Horse/Pony Feed Book must be submitted in a binder or notebook. No loose pages please. Judging is done at Fair and must be completed to be eligible for Horse Project Year Award(s).
- \*\*All signatures are required on the "signature page".
- \*\*Project Animal must be registered by May 1st of the project year. Exception to this must be clearly documented in the record book. Exceptions include, but are not limited to, purchase or lease of project horse/pony after May 1st, death of animal, health condition and have approval from Cheboygan HDC.
- \*\*A feed record book must be kept on each project horse/pony. Only one project horse/pony per a feed record book

## INSTRUCTIONS FOR COMPLETING YOUR HORSE/PONY FEED RECORD BOOK

Cover Page-4-Her's age is determined by the age on Jan 1st of the 4-H year. Year in the project does include the current year. Photo must be clearly show the full body view of the project horse/pony

Description of project horse/pony- the description of the horse/pony color and marking must be proper terminology. If Horse/Pony is registered through a breed association, include a copy of registration paper. Include copy of your current 4-H year May 1st project horse/pony certificate. Markings include scars, brands and tattoos.

Value of Project- record starting and end value of your project horse/pony.

Inventory Sheets- This is a listing of items you have purchased or received as a gift that you use for your horse/pony or to show your horse/pony. Include individual costs and totals. If item was a gift, estimate the value. Beginning inventory records should begin on September 1st. Ending Inventory should list items, purchased or received after Sept 1st. to the close of the feed record book.

Time Spent with Your Horse/Pony- keep track of the time you spend with your horse/pony doing feeding, stall cleaning, grooming, training, riding or driving or showing. One page per month and total bottom of each page.

Health Record- Health records should begin on Sept 1st and end when the feed record book is considered completed (should match end date on cover of feed record book)


