#### CSUS ENDOWED FELLOWSHIPS



The Department of Community Sustainability each year accepts applications from MS and PhD students for 7 endowed fellowships that are awarded in the Spring Graduate Awards ceremony. Each award has its own eligibility requirements and selection criteria. Please consult the awards website and prepare your materials to emphasize these criteria.

- 1. The **Malcolm and Ann Kerr Award for Excellence in Scholarship**: first established in 2017, to provide an opportunity for top PhD students in the Department of Community Sustainability to gain university teaching experience so that they may become more competitive for faculty positions after graduation.
- 2. The **George & Nancy Axinn International Scholarship**: endowed by Professors George and Nancy Axinn to support MS and PhD graduate students who wish to pursue careers in international development.
- 3. The **Milton H. Steinmueller Fellowship in Natural Resources and Environmental Policy:** established with gifts from alumni, colleagues, and friends to honor the career of Dr. Milton Steinmueller, this award supports PhD students having a passion for and career goal to teach in natural resources and environmental policy.
- 4. The Harriette B. Sherman Scholarship in Recreation and Tourism Systems: created by Mr. Bob Ruigh to support non-traditional MS and PhD students enrolled in Department of Community Sustainability and who are pursuing studies in the area of recreation and tourism systems.
- 5. The **Gilbert W. Mouser Scholarship in Conservation and Environmental Education:** established by Dr. John McVickar to recognize outstanding MS and PhD graduate students in the College of Agriculture and Natural Resources who are focused on the study and practice of conservation and environmental education.
- 6. The Jon F. Bartholic Ensuring the Future of Michigan's Water Resource Fund: by Dr. Jon Bartholic to support graduate research and community-based projects that examine land and water resources problems to ensure the future of Michigan water resources.
- 7. The Frank Fear Fellowship for Excellence in Community Engagement: established in 2021, this award recognizes outstanding MS and PhD graduate students in the Department of Community Sustainability who excel as scholars and in the democratic practice of community engagement.

Note that award committees are appointed after applications are received to avoid any conflict of interest.

- Completed application cover form (Students must be in "good standing" at time of application; see box below)
- Student application letter that presents qualifications as related to the selection criteria for the award
- Updated transcript (can be photocopy or unofficial; we can use MSU application transcripts for new students)
- Updated resumé
- Letter of support from student's advisor that addresses student qualifications relative to the selection criteria, Can be submitted separately by advisor
- Additional letter of recommendation, also addressing student's qualifications and eligibility for this specific fellowship

DEADLINES: Submit complete Kerr scholarship application packet NO LATER THAN October 15th

Submit complete application packet for other awards NO LATER THAN December 1st
