Health Equity Defined

Health equity is the state in which everyone has a fair and just opportunity to attain their highest level of health. Achieving this requires focused and ongoing societal efforts to address historical and contemporary injustices; overcome economic, social, and other obstacles to health and healthcare; and eliminate preventable health.

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Awareness

Trust

How is the community being included in decisions?



Adaptations / Tailoring

Did you make any adaptations, if so, what were the adaptations made?

How did you go about this process? What worked?

What didn't work or was challenging?
