What is a Food Council?

The [Michigan Local Food Council Network](#) (MLFCN) defines a food council as a group of representatives, community members, and stakeholders from many sectors of the food system. These councils are formed to organize, define, and amplify the needs and voices of their communities surrounding issues of food security, sustainability, equity, and accessibility.

The MLFCN is coordinated by Michigan State University Center for Regional Food Systems and facilitates peer-to-peer learning to build councils' individual and collective capacities to work on food and food policy issues, operate effectively, and engage their communities. The MLFCN's main roles are to:

- Foster a space for local councils to network with one another
- Connect local councils to statewide and national policy information, issues, and actions
- Assist local food councils with capacity building, including hands-on training
- Connect local policy information, issues, and actions to other parts of the state.
