WHOLESALE MARKET FACTSHEETS

In 2024, the “Research Supporting African MSMEs to Provide Safe and Nutritious Food” (RSM2SNF) project conducted a survey of wholesale markets for tomato and green leafy vegetables around Tanzania. We visited 45 markets in 8 cities all across the country (a complete census of the markets directly serving these 8 cities).

The survey gathered information on wholesale market operations, services available, distances to amenities, and market-level leadership. For tomato and amaranth, the survey also gathered information on the catchment area (source and destination) of the product, quantities that pass through the market, governance and leadership at the product-level, waste management, and other topics.



Key pieces of information are presented here in a standardized format for each market (a market factsheet). This makes it easy to look up information for a particular market, and to compare information across markets.
