MSU Extension is thrilled to partner again in 2025 with the [Michigan State Fair](#) on an exciting program for Michigan youth: the Michigan State Fair 4-H & Youth Virtual Showcase. This statewide showcase provides a virtual platform for youth across Michigan to exhibit their work in all project areas and apply for up to \$10,000 in scholarships. Any Michigan youth ages 5-19 is encouraged to participate; 4-H membership is not required.

[Registration for this event is now open!](#) The diverse array of [classes](#) celebrate all the projects and programs in which youth have developed skill and mastery. This includes livestock and animal showmanship classes, as well as still exhibits, educational projects and more.



There is no cost to participate and youth may engage in as many classes as they wish by [submitting project photos and videos](#). **Be sure to submit your entries by the registration deadline of August 8 at 5 p.m..** Project evaluation will occur before the start of the Michigan State Fair so that winners can be announced at the event which occurs August 28 – September 1.

In addition to the opportunity to showcase their skills, recognize their accomplishments and receive constructive feedback for growth and development, participants in the Michigan State Fair 4-H & Youth Virtual Showcase will also have the opportunity to apply for up to \$10,000 in scholarships. Hello everyone!!!

In true Extension fashion our work never stops! We certainly hope everyone had a great time during Exploration Days and has made it home safely.

Regarding the summer weather hitting hard this weekend, the Animal Science team wanted to reach out with suggestions for the heat wave ahead.

With temperatures being expected to reach upper 90s with heat index values being above 100 degrees over the next few days, we need to stay diligent in paying attention to ourselves and the care of our animals.

Remember:

- Provide access to a fresh, cool, clean water supply ([Animal welfare at the fair: Water consumption - 4-H Animal Science](#))
- Provide a place for the animal to get out of the sun, if possible
- Provide shade, sprinklers, or fans and other species-appropriate methods to help keep animals cool

Sudden weather changes like this can cause animals to experience heat stress. More on heat stress and how to manage that can be found at [Animal welfare at the fair: Heat stress - 4-H Animal Science](#).

Events where animals are being exhibited should monitor conditions closely and consider rescheduling due to the weather if needed. It is important to remember that we should provide the best care we can for our animals and practice the best husbandry skills along the way.

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Empowering youth for success: How 4-H volunteers can prepare 4-H'ers for fairs and showcase events

Fairs and showcase events can be the highlight of the year for many Michigan 4-H members, offering a platform to showcase their hard work, learn new skills and make lasting memories. 4-H volunteers play a crucial role in guiding and supporting youth through this exciting but often daunting process.

Michigan State University Extension offers some suggestions for ways volunteers can help prepare youth for a successful fair or showcase experience:

- **Project selection, planning and skill development:** 4-H volunteers can assist youth in selecting projects that align with their spark, interests and abilities. This involves helping youth set realistic goals, plan their projects and understand the requirements and deadlines for participation in the fair or showcase. Volunteers can provide resources, share their own experiences, and connect youth with experts or mentors. Organizing and leading workshops is an effective way for volunteers to teach essential skills. Hands-on workshops can boost youth's confidence and competence before they are in a situation where they are being judged or scored.
- **Record keeping and documentation:** Proper record keeping is essential for 4-H projects. Volunteers can teach youth how to maintain detailed records of their work, expenses and progress. This not only helps in fair preparations but also instills valuable organizational skills. Volunteers can also review and provide feedback on record books to ensure they meet fair standards. Michigan 4-H has fillable animal science record books and a fillable guide for member's personal record that can assist members in getting started.
- **Mock judging and feedback:** Simulating the judging process can help youth understand what to expect and how to present their projects effectively. Volunteers can conduct mock judging sessions, offer constructive criticism and teach presentation skills. This practice can reduce anxiety and improve the overall quality of the entries.
- **Encouragement and emotional support:** Preparing for a fair or showcase can be stressful for young participants. Volunteers play a key role in offering encouragement, celebrating achievements and providing emotional support. A positive and supportive environment helps youth stay motivated, enjoy the learning process and leads to youth
- **Promoting teamwork and community involvement:** Encouraging youth to work together and participate in group projects fosters teamwork and community spirit. Volunteers can organize team-building activities, facilitate group entries into the fair and promote a sense of camaraderie among members.

By providing guidance, resources and support, 4-H volunteers can significantly enhance the fair and showcase preparation experience for youth. Volunteer involvement not only helps in creating successful projects but also contributes to the personal growth and development of young members. The fair and showcase becomes more than just an event; it becomes a milestone in the 4-H journey, thanks to the dedication and efforts of volunteers.
