BentonTM is a mid-season, excellent quality dark red sweet cherry. Similar to *Bing* in appearance, the fruit is large but ripens a few days before *Bing*, has excellent firmness, and superior flavor. BentonTM produces a vigorous tree that is similar in branching angle to *Bing*. It blooms later than *Bing*, consistently crops well, has lower susceptibility to rain cracking than *Bing*, and is self fertile.



In consumer evaluations at the local Prosser Farmer's Market, *Benton*TM has performed better than all other cherries, including *Bing*, due to its superior flavor and quality.

Production and compatibility of $Benton^{\rm TM}$ on rootstocks other than Mazzard is unknown at this time. $Benton^{\rm TM}$ is susceptible to powdery mildew.
