## Glacier<sup>TM</sup>

Parents: Stella x Early Burlat Cross made in 1971 by Tom Toyama. Tested as PC7144-7.





U.S. Plant Patent (#8051) assigned to Washington State University Research Foundation and licensed in North America to the Northwest Nursery Improvement Institute.

Glacier™ is a large mid-season, self-fruitful black, round sweet cherry. It is not as firm as Bing, so it may not be suitable for shipping to long-distance markets. Its large size and self-fruitful characteristic make it most suitable for home growers. Its stems are long and slender. The flesh is dark-red and juicy.



Glacier<sup>TM</sup> is a late blooming variety so it may avoid damage from spring frosts. It is self-fertile so it doesn't need cross-pollinizers.

Production and compatibility of  $\textit{Glacier}^{\text{TM}}$  on rootstocks other than Mazzard is unknown at this time.
