Quiet Adventures Symposium - March 4th: 9am-5:30pm, MSU Pavilion, 4301 Farm Ln, Lansing, MI 48910

Lead environmental and outdoor education activities for youth attending the **Quiet Adventures Symposium**: An annual event featuring seminars and presentations by noted outdoor authors, researchers, and conservationists. The symposium is hosted by the Quiet Water Society, whose mission is to promote non-motorized (quiet) outdoor recreation.

- Sensory Table This would be geared towards the real young kids and consist of rice, cornmeal, etc. with measuring tools, toys, etc. that they can play with.
- Trash to Treasures Youth could use a variety of "trash" items (plastic caps, soda can tabs, etc.) to create puppets (or other projects). The focus would be on littering, trash, and recycling.
- Fashion a Michigan Fish Youth would create (draw) fish incorporating characteristics from adaptation cards that they select. The adaptation cards would include things such as coloration/camouflage, body shape/form, mouth type, etc.
- Build a Bug Like the fish activity, youth would create their own bugs, using various craft supplies (pipe cleaners, feathers, googly eyes, etc.) to represent adaptations.
- Foil Boats Youth would be given a piece of aluminum foil to design and build a boat. When finished, they would have the opportunity to test the buoyancy of their boat by putting it in water and placing pennies on it until it sinks.
- Bird Feeders Pinecone feeders and feeders made from plastic bottles.



As we start to think ahead to the New Year, how can 4-H clubs resolve to improve in the year ahead? Here are ten suggestions to make the upcoming year a successful one.

Resolve that:

- 1. Club meetings will start and end on time.
- 2. Business meetings will follow Robert's Rules of Order and that all club paperwork, such as minutes, club inventory and financial statements, will be completed in a timely manner.
- 3. All members will take part in discussions and have a say in decisions that are made. Keep a chart with each members' name and when they speak at business meetings.
- 4. The club meeting place will be a safe, comfortable and welcoming environment for all club members.
- Fun will be included in each meeting.
- 6. A learning activity will be included in each club meeting. Ideas include exploring a new 4-H curriculum, having members volunteer to do a demonstration, doing a show and tell about each members' favorite project, or bringing in a guest speaker.
- 7. The club will pursue at least one community service project chosen, planned and celebrated by the club.
- 8. New members will have a buddy they may talk with about any 4-H questions.
- 9. The 4-H pledge will be said at every meeting.
- 10. Every club member will be recognized in some way to let them know they are cared about.
