World Food Prize Michigan Youth Institute!

What is the WFPMIYI? The World Food Prize Michigan Youth Institute is a one-day event that provides middle and high school students with the opportunity to share their ideas on how we can solve critical global challenges. More information is available @ https://www.canr.msu.edu/wfpmiyi/index

When and where: The World Food Prize Michigan Youth Institute will be held Thursday, May 11, 2023, from 9 a.m. to 3 p.m. (Eastern Time Zone). Participants have the option of joining the World Food Prize Michigan Youth Institute in person on the campus of MSU in East Lansing, MI or by participating virtually using Zoom. New this year is an optional Networking Breakfast scheduled from 7:30 – 8:45 a.m. This will be a chance to meet some of the experts, MSU Extension staff, and other students informally before the day officially begins at 9 a.m. If you would like to attend the Networking Breakfast, select this option when you register.

Who: Students who are in grades 7 through 12 during the 2022-2023 school year are eligible to register by submitting a three-to-five-page paper that is written using our <u>Michigan Youth Institute Global Challenge Guide</u>. Teachers and Adult Mentors are also welcome to attend the event along with their students.

Cost: There is no registration fee for students or teachers/mentors to participate in the Institute thanks to the generous support of the Michigan 4-H Foundation, the World Food Prize Foundation, the MSU College of Agriculture and Natural Resources, MSU International Studies and Programs, MSU Extension, Michigan 4-H, and Michigan FFA. Lunch is provided for those attending the program in-person on the campus of MSU.

Registration deadline: March 15, 2023.

Apply for the Michigan 4-H State Awards!

Michigan 4-H true leaders ages 11 and older have an opportunity to be recognized for the great work they do in 4-H and develop their career skills by completing a state award application. A Michigan 4-H State Award is the highest honor bestowed on a Michigan 4-H member and provides an opportunity to receive recognition for their engagement in rich learning experiences that result in outstanding knowledge and life-skill development.

State award applications are divided into four categories: Mark of Excellence essay contest (11-12 years old), junior state award (13-15 years old), senior state award (16-19 years old) and group awards
