






Workshops:

Exploring cultures while gardening and cooking with kids – all ages, fun for families \$

Gardening is a great way to introduce kids to a variety of fruits and vegetables. Exploring the origins of the foods we love and where the ingredients grow is a fun way to incorporate the exploration of world cultures into your garden. Kids can research new recipes or create their own recipes, learning new ways to prepare their harvest into tasty dishes. Eating new foods is a great way to learn to appreciate people from all backgrounds, from across town to across the world.

Viticulture - the Science of Growing Grapes - ages 12-19

Plant Science for Cloverbuds – ages 5-8 \$



This workshop provides a fun, hands-on way for youth to understand the consequences of development activities around inland lakes, and how recreational activities around and on the lake affect the lake's overall health. Through an interactive game, participants will belong to a "group" of people who have specific ideals about Lake 4-H, "their lake". Each group of people use the lake for different purposes: their livelihood, recreation, and relaxation. Each group acts in its own interest, and each group's actions have consequences for the entire lake.



4-H Volunteer Nomination Required

Outstanding Young Member

Requirement to Apply: 4-H member 8-11 years old (4-H Age)

Number of Awards: One per club

Application Process: Nomination Form completed by 4-H volunteer based on young member's character

Award: Certificate

Outstanding Teen Leader

Requirement to Apply: 4-H teens recognized for outstanding leadership 4-H volunteer

Number of Awards: Two

Application Process: Nomination Form completed by 4-H volunteer (can nominate up to two teens)

Award: Certificate and pin

All Star Award

Requirement to Apply: Any youth nominated by a 4-H volunteer for any reason determined by the 4-H volunteer

Number of Awards: One per club

Application Process: Nomination Form completed by 4-H volunteer

Award: Certificate and pin

Good Citizen Award

Requirement to Apply: All youth are eligible to be nominated (by anyone) for going above and beyond normal expectations through their actions. (Please no nominations for normal daily activities such as feeding own animals, barn duty, etc.)

Number of Awards: Up to five winners and honorable mention recognition to additional nominees

Application Process: Completion of nomination form

Award: \$5 Gift Certificate for up to 5 winners: Certificate for honorable mention
