

Small Animal Showmanship Clinics:

All will be held at the Small Animal barn at the Fairgrounds from 6:30 PM - 7:30 PM

**Clinics will be cancelled if temperatures reach 85 degrees or higher, it is a good idea to plan to attend the earliest available date.

- **Poultry Members** To continue keeping the fair birds safe of Avian Influenza, NO live birds will brought to the clinics. We will utilize fake birds to teach showman-ship. If you have any questions, please contact one of the poultry superintendents.
- Goat Members Goats that will be entered in the small animal auction at the fair MUST have a scrapie tag BEFORE weigh-in. It is a <u>State mandate</u>, and if your auction goat does not have a scrapie tag, you will not be allowed to sell. ALL goats must have some identification; either the scrapie tag or a tattoo with matching papers, for those not in the auction. Goat weigh-in is May 4 from 11 AM - 1 PM for MARKET doe kids and wethers, the wethers must be dehorned and castrated. It is located in the Small Animal Barn at the Fairgrounds.

Still Exhibit, Horses, Dairy, and Small Animal sign-up will open May 19 at 8:00 AM. Registration will <u>close on June 13 at 10:00 p.m.</u> ***There will be NO EXCEPTIONS for late entries***

There are a few things to take note of:

- There will be a message box that pops up AFTER submitting sign up for small animals. Click on the link in the box to sign up for your small animal auction project.
- There is a separate form for the Cloverbud craft section. Cloverbuds are not allowed to sell in the Still Exhibit Auction.
- You will get a "receipt" from Google following your registration to the email that you used to sign up. If you do NOT receive an email within 24 hours of your sign up, contact Kapre at <u>kaprefilhart@gmail.com</u> to make sure that your sign up went through. ALL sign ups are due June 13 at 10 PM. There will be no exceptions.
- You will need to know which project you plan to sell for the Still Exhibit Auction upon signing up (crafts sign up AND auction form due on June 13!). There is a second section under each still exhibit department that will allow you to indicate whether or not you wish to sell a project from that section. You are still only allowed to sell ONE item for still exhibit auction. You will need to know which exhibit you are selling at the time of sign up. Cloverbuds are not allowed to sell still exhibits.

**Large Animal/Livestock Exhibitors (dairy feeders, beef, swine, and sheep) do not have a sign up because your sign-up is your tag-in/weigh-in. HOWEVER, you DO need to fill out the drug use form that can be found on the website using the drop down menu under the Large Animals tab.

Camping News for Fair Week:

The campground is full. Camping permits may be picked up at the Fair Office starting July 1, until the start of fair. Side by side permits will be available for \$25 and a copy of your liability insurance policy showing at least \$300,000 for liability. Weekly parking passes are \$20.

Campers may be moved in on Friday, July 18 after 1 PM and must leave by Sunday, July 27 by 1 PM. Campers that come early or leave later will be charged \$40 per day.

Camp sites are measured half way between your electric pole and the next electric pole. You must stay within your space. Slides and awning must also be within your space. We understand we have a lot of group camping, which is fine, please be sure to stay within your group sites. Double check before you unhook your camper.

Amusement Ride Special:

Advance Amusement Ride Passes are now available for sale. Cost is \$20 per pass. One pass is good for exchange of a wristband the day you plan to ride rides. Daily prices are; \$25 Monday, Tuesday, Wednesday, Thursday, and Friday; Saturday is \$30.

Michigan 4-H license plate now available!

Michigan drivers have a new way to show their 4-H pride while supporting 4-H youth development programming: through the purchase of the newly released <u>Michigan 4-H</u> license plate. Available at the Michigan Secretary of State, the plate prominently displays the signature 4-H clover and part of the proceeds from every sale and renewal will go to support Michigan 4-H youth.

"We are elated that the Michigan 4-H license plate is officially here," said Quentin Tyler, director of Michigan State University Extension, which is home to the Michigan 4-H program. "We hope the many members of our Michigan 4-H community –youth, parents, alumni and supporters – will consider supporting 4-H by purchasing a plate as they renew their licenses this year."

Similar to other special cause fundraising license plates in the state, the Michigan 4-H license plate will cost \$35, with \$25 of the purchase fee benefiting Michigan 4-H Youth Development. A \$10 fee will also be charged to benefit Michigan 4-H when the plate is renewed. License plates may be ordered by visiting Michigan.gov/sos, by mailing in a form or scheduling a visit to any Secretary of State office. The plate will be delivered by mail in two to three weeks.

Michigan 4-H Foundation opens 2024-25 grant cycle

Awarded annually, the Michigan 4-H Foundation recently opened their grant and award opportunities for the 2025-2026 season. Open to 4-H volunteer leaders, members and staff, the grants and awards support local 4-H clubs and county programs. **All applications are due June 1.**

"County 4-H programs and clubs have so many unique programs," said Abbey Miller, director of the Michigan 4-H Foundation. "Thanks to the support of our generous 4-H donor community, we are pleased to offer mini-grants to support these many wonderful programs."

Opportunities include:

- Michigan 4-H Legacy Grants of \$1,000. These grants are awarded to support development of a new program or initiative or to strengthen, enhance or expand a current program that is making a difference.
- 4-H On-Target Grants of \$500. These grants support 4-H Shooting Sports programs to enhance existing programs, develop a new program or offer a special experience related to 4-H Shooting Sports.
- The Collins 4-H Youth Horticulture Grant of \$500. This grant is available only to 4-H youth clubs and supports advancement of club work in plant science and horticulture activities.
- **4-H Educational Garden Grants of \$1,000.** These grants support the creation of local 4-H educational gardens in Michigan.
