Additional Information

Buying for Processing vs. Buying and Selling for Support example:

Example: Bid \$4.00/pound for 1,200lb steer with \$1.25 support price

Buying for processing: \$4.00 x 1,200lbs = \$4,800 (will also pay butcher fees directly to processor)

Buying and selling for support: \$4.00 - \$1.25 = \$2.75 \$2.75 x 1,200lbs = \$3,300

Live Animal Weight vs. Hanging Weight vs. Packaged Weight

Live weight: How much the animal weighs on the hoof.

Hanging weight: Weight given by processor after hide, head and entrails are removed.

Packaged weight: Take home weight after bones are removed and meat is trimmed and packaged.

The table below shows approximate yields.

	Live Weight	Hanging Weight	Packaged Weight
Sheep	130 lbs	70 lbs	48 lbs
Swine	250 lbs	175 lbs	125 lbs
Beef	1,200 lbs	750 lbs	490 lbs

- Charitable tax deduction.

PURCHASE OPTIONS

- Buy the animal and send it for processing, you pay your per pound bid price times the weight of the animal. You will choose your processor during the check out process and will be responsible for contacting them the Monday after the Auction with your cutting order. The Livestock Association will transport the animal to the processor for you. You may also take the animal home.
- Buy the animal and sell it for support to a local livestock yard, you pay the difference between your per pound bid price and the support price noted in the sale catalog times the weight to the animal. The Livestock Association will handle marketing and transporting the animal to the livestock yard.
- Add-on a flat dollar amount to any 4-H/FFA member's animal by completing an add on form during the auction.



PAYMENT OPTIONS

- Cash or check the day of the auction.
- Credit card the day of the auction, buyer will be responsible for processing fees.
- Invoice after the auction, payment is net 30 days.
- Returned checks will be subject to a \$35 processing fee.

Please note that 4-H and FFA members only receive their auction checks once all their buyers have paid in full.

<u>FAQs</u>

- Can I purchase an animal if I am unable to attend the Auction? Yes, complete the enclosed proxy form and return it to the MSU Extension Office prior to the Auction.
- What time should I arrive? Plan to arrive early to view animals and talk to 4-H/FFA members. Lunch begins at 12:00pm and registration will begin at 12:30pm.
 Auction begins at 2:00pm.
- Can more than one person purchase an animal? Yes, all names and addresses for the group must be provided to an Auction Clerk for billing purposes.
- Who will handle billing and/or payment questions? The Large Animal Livestock Auction Coordinator.
