- Who is eligible?
  - Public Bodies
  - Local Governments
  - Non-profit Organizations
  - Native American Tribes
- What types of projects are eligible?
  - Food Banks
  - School Cafeterias
  - Farmers Markets
  - Community Kitchens
- Rural = communities under 20,000 population

## Rural Business Enterprise Grant (RBEG)

- Who is eligible?
  - Public Bodies
  - Local Governments
  - Non-profit Organizations
  - Native American Tribes
- What types of projects are eligible?
  - Development of Food Hub
  - Farm to School Program Assistance
  - Farmers Markets
  - Kitchen Incubators
- Rural = communities under 50,000 population

## What's the Difference?

- Population
- CF focuses on enhancing services to the community
- RBEG focuses on assisting business & creating or saving jobs
- CF makes awards throughout the year
- RBEG is awarded once in the spring
- Applications accepted year round in both

## Value Added Producer Grant (VAPG)

- Who is eligible?
  - Independent Producers
  - Farmer/Rancher Cooperative
  - Agriculture Producer Groups
- What types of projects are eligible?
  - Assist ag producers entering into or expanding value-added activities
    - Planning
    - Working Capital
  - No purchase of real estate, buildings or equipment
  - You must currently grow the commodity to which you are adding value
  - 50/50 Matching Grant Program

## Rural Energy for America Program (REAP)

- Who is eligible?
  - Farmers
  - Small Businesses in rural areas (< 50,000)
- What types of projects are eligible?
  - Renewable energy systems that create energy
    - Anaerobic Digesters, solar, bio-mass, etc.
  - Energy efficiency projects that reduce energy use
    - New lights, motors, refrigeration/freezer units, etc.
  - 75/25 Matching Grant Program

## Helpful Tips

- First thing you should do is contact RD.  
We will verify:
  - Site eligibility
  - Applicant eligibility
  - Scope of project fits parameters of program
  - Make sure you are working with the right person in our Agency

## Helpful Tips

- Competitive Grants – get scoring criteria
- Read & re-read the question – make sure your answer directly addresses the question/topic
- Assume the reviewer doesn't know anything about your project, geographic area or you
- Turn it in BEFORE the deadline


