





The Secretary's Minutes

Minutes should include



- Name of club or group
- Place and date of meeting
- Kind of meeting (regular or special)
- Who presided
- Time meeting started
- Members and guests present
- Approval of minutes of previous meeting
- Treasurer's report
- Committee reports
- Complete motions, with the name of person
- Important points discussed, if they are valuable for future reference
- If a vote is needed, the result of the vote
- Leader announcements
- Adjournment
- Outline of educational program (depending on when this happens, it would be either before or after adjournment)
- Secretary's signature

Minutes should not include



- Name of the person who seconds the motion
- Personal opinions
- The number of individuals voting for or against a motion (unless conducting a roll call vote, or a tie occurs with the president breaking the tie)
