Welcome Back 4-H Face-to-Face Programs

This month 4-H begins to see a gradual return to face-to-face programming all across Michigan, and you will continue to see new virtual offerings as well. Our 2022-23 plans are taking shape to send a delegation to another state to stay with approved 4-H families and then we will host teens from that state back here in our own Roscommon County the following year. Participating teens will be doing fundraising to help raise the cost of airfare as well as hosting visits to sites like Mackinac Island. This is going to be one of those unforgettable experiences for our 4-H participants. We are open to all, so get involved in what you find interesting.

We are hosting a 4-H day camp here that will be very hands-on for those ages 8-12. They will roll up their sleeves and explore some fun science for the day. The theme is transportation or movement. We will play with planes, trains and explore objects of movement. We have some protocols to follow to ensure that kids stay safe. 4-H Exploration Days—Expanded is coming in June. It won't replace the three days on the MSU campus, but the virtual experience will be fun, with engaging classes and free-time activities. Teens will explore topics from the Upper Peninsula to nuclear laboratories. We were able to offer full scholarships to every teen from Roscommon County who registered.

Dare to Serve! Roscommon County is experiencing a gypsy moth infestation. 4-H is stepping up with our Moth Busters project, enlisting youth to learn about gypsy moth and manage their populations. See the full project kit at the end of this newsletter!

MSU Extension resumes limited 4-H face-to-face programming

Over the past several months, MSU Extension has been working diligently to chart a path toward resuming in-person programming during the current public health crisis. Thanks to the thoughtfully crafted guidelines created by MSU Extension professionals, we are excited to share that MSU Extension will resume hosting face-to-face programs and events that adhere to public health guidelines.

As of May 17, Michigan 4-H professionals and volunteers may submit a request to host an in-person event that follows specific guidelines and requirements. The health and safety of program participants and volunteers, as well as their families and our staff, remains the top priority. All guidelines outlined by MSU Extension are based on the [Centers for Disease Control and Prevention](#) (CDC), [Michigan Department of Health and Human Services](#) (MDHHS), and the [MSU Community Compact](#) and *must be followed closely*.

As we begin expanding our in-person offerings, communication, transparency and collaboration are essential for the safety and well-being of all parties. MSU Extension expectations regarding programming and events will remain fluid and subject to change at any time based on evolving guidance from the CDC, MDHHS and the MSU Community Compact. Groups should continue to provide options (including virtual) for participation to ensure all participants can remain involved given their individual circumstances.
