### Select an Authentic Task

Ask yourself- "What indicates that I have met these standards/learning objectives?" This will help you develop a set of relevant tasks.

Traditional.....	Authentic
Selecting a response.....	Performing a task
Contrived .....	Real Life
Recall/Recognition .....	Construction/Application
Teacher-structured .....	Learner-structured
Indirect evidence.....	Direct evidence

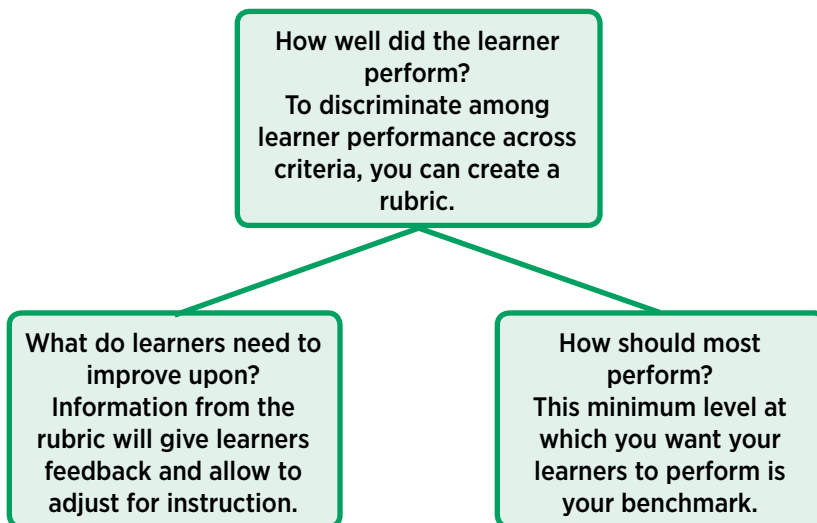
### Types of Assessment Methods

- ▶ Portfolio- Digital/electronic/ web-based
- ▶ Special projects/ capstones
- ▶ Journals/learning-logs/digital learning records
- ▶ Conferences/interviews
- ▶ Oral examinations
- ▶ Self-/peer-assessment
- ▶ Collaborative projects
- ▶ Performances
- ▶ Experiments/research studies/ visuals
- ▶ Case study
- ▶ Service learning
- ▶ Internships- logs/journals/ reflections

### Criteria

- ▶ What does good performance on this task look like?
- ▶ So, what does a good criterion look like? It should be clearly stated; brief; observable, statement of behavior, written in language students understands.
- ▶ Guidelines:
  - Limit the number of criteria; keep it to the essential elements of the tasks.
  - You do not have to assess everything on every task.
  - Smaller, less significant tasks usually require fewer criteria.
