Department 16 - Horses & Ponies

General Rules and Information

- Horse Project members and their parents/guardians are responsible for knowing and obeying the rules governing the exhibition of horses and ponies in the youth Horse Department at the fair including the Michigan 4-H Horse and Pony Project Show Rules & Regulations. Members may be disciplined by loss of privileges including, but not limited to, loss of fair premium monies and awards; dismissal from a given class(es), and removal of project animal(s) from the fairgrounds. For current year horse project rules and patterns see www.canr.msu.edu/st joseph/4-h/4 h horse and pony.
- 2. All project animals <u>must</u> be registered in the St. Joseph County MSU Extension office by <u>May 1</u> of the current project year. All exhibitors may only show animals signed up in exhibitor's name at the St. Joseph County fair. Members are responsible for supplying the following information, on registration forms, regarding each project animal: name, sex, age, breed, <u>3 ½" x 2½" FULL BODY sideview color photo.</u>
- Exhibitors may register and show up to six project animals at the fair.
- 4. Exhibitors may enter only one exhibit per class.

 Attention: If you choose to show a given 4-H project animal in BOTH a Fitting & Showmanship class and a Horsemanship class, the animal must be shown in the same type of Fitting & Showmanship and Horsemanship classes (i.e., a horse shown in a Gymkhana Fitting & Showmanship class would need to be shown in the corresponding (based on exhibitor age) Gymkhana Horsemanship class, etc.)
- 5. Exhibitors <u>will not</u> be allowed to enter or exhibit in this species department if exhibited at another county fair during the current year.
- 6. Stallions may not be shown/exhibited at the St. Joseph County Grange Fair.
- 7. A pony is any animal 56" and under. A miniature is any animal 38" and under. The pony/miniature must be

- measured and registered with a St. Joseph County Pony ID number. See current pony measurement list at www.canr.msu.edu/st_joseph/4-h/4 h horse and pony#Pony.
- 8. The exhibitor <u>must</u> wear appropriate footwear (i.e., riding boots or approved riding shoes with heels) whenever he/she is mounted on a horse. Exhibitor must also wear an approved ASTM-SEI helmet for the following disciplines: Ridden Gymkhana classes and Hunter classes (including any classes where the exhibitor rides "hunt style"), Saddle Seat, Competitive Trail, Jumping, Classical Dressage, Bareback and at <u>all</u> practice events. The helmets <u>must</u> meet the American Society for testing and Materials (ASTM) testing standards, <u>must</u> be manufactured and distributed by a participant in the certification program of the Safety Equipment Institute (SEI) and <u>must</u> bear the SEI certification label. (See 4-H Bulletin "<u>Michigan 4-H Horse and Pony Project Rules and Regulations</u>".)
- All exhibitors <u>are required</u> to wear the number assigned by 4-H Horse Council (HC) for each corresponding horse/exhibitor combination while being judged in any 4-H class at the St. Joseph County Fair.
- 10. All animals must be checked in by exhibitor or immediate family member unless prior arrangements are made in writing and filed at the MSU Extension office 24 hours in advance of check in times at the fair.
- 11. All horses and ponies <u>must</u> be checked-in and stalled at the fairgrounds by 5:00 p.m. Saturday, September 13, 2025. HC Executive Board will do a walk through from 5:00 6:00 p.m. Horses must remain in their stalls during this time. Horses and ponies may arrive Friday, September 12, 2025 per leader permission.
- 12. All requests for trailering in are to be made in writing to the 4-H Horse/Pony Project Superintendent, or in their absence to the Assistant Superintendent. For a copy of the form see www.canr.msu.edu/stjoseph/4-h/4 h horse and pony#Forms.
- 13. Each club member will be responsible for filling at least one stall at fair. Equine to be stalled must be on file in the county registration book and have a negative Coggins.

Health Requirements

- 14. See www.michigan.gov/mdard/animals/exhibitions.
- 15. Michigan law requires that all equine entered in exhibitions, expositions or fairs must test <u>negative</u> to an official Equine Infectious Anemia (EIA) test (Coggins Test) within the calendar year, or the previous 30 days, and be able to present proof in the form of an official EIA laboratory report (Coggins Test Report). Proof of testing will be required as follows:
 - A. A <u>copy</u> of the Coggins Test Report for each horse/pony to be exhibited at fair <u>must</u> be attached to the exhibitor's Horse Fair Entry Form.
 - B. The exhibitor <u>must</u> have the <u>original</u> Coggins Test Report <u>on-site</u> at the fairgrounds and <u>must</u> be prepared to produce the test report upon request.
- 16. All 4-H project animals intended for exhibition at fair <u>must</u> be physically able to be stalled at the fair for the <u>entire week</u>.
- 17. Exhibitors who remove their project animal(s) from the fairgrounds without approval will forfeit their related premiums and will not be allowed to exhibit in any remaining fair classes. Once removed, project animal will not be allowed on fairgrounds the remainder of the week. See your leader or Horse Council Board member if removal is needed, as a vet check may be required. Fee for the veterinarian is only assessed if care is provided.
- 18. All horses and ponies <u>must</u> be fed, watered, and exercised daily.

Fair Rules and Information

- 19. Exhibitors must stable a 4-H project animal in the 4-H Barns on the fairgrounds unless approved by the HC Board.
- 20. A given exhibitor in this division may receive premiums for no more than five classes.
- 21. Classes may be divided at the discretion of the 4-H Horse Project Superintendent and/or MSU Extension. Note: Classes may be combined/dropped due to low entry numbers.
- 22. An <u>award</u> will be awarded in each class provided there is a <u>worthy</u> exhibitor as determined by the judge.
- 23. Horses and ponies must be ridden using a bridle, hackamore, or bosal.
- 24. Horses and ponies may <u>not</u> be ridden/driven in the barns or in any of the areas where campers are parked.
- 25. Horses and ponies may only be led out of the <u>east</u> end of the barns.
- 26. All stalls must be cleaned daily.
- 27. Horses and ponies must be returned to their stall each night by 9:45 p.m.
- Horses and ponies may only be washed in the <u>designated</u> wash areas.
- 29. Horses and ponies may <u>not</u> be tied to any practice ring or show arena <u>fence</u> at any time.
- 30. Horses and ponies, when tied, must be properly and safely secured with a halter and lead rope or trailer tie. Bridles must be removed. No neck tying. Failure to follow this safety rule could result in dismissal.
- 31. All **breed standard** grooming techniques (including extensions) are allowed.
- 32. Exercising of 4-H horses and ponies: 4-H horses and ponies <u>must</u> be on lead while going to and from the designated exercise areas.

Horse Sharing Rules and Information

- 33. Primary and Secondary participants may not enter the same class, with the exception of one-at-a-time, set patterned classes. (examples: dressage tests, gymkhana pattern classes, in-hand jumping classes, trail, any class that does not require that both the primary and secondary participant be exhibiting in the arena at the same time, etc.)
- 34. Both members hereby agree to meet any guidelines established by the St. Joseph County 4-H Horse Council, Program Coordinator, and/or specialty leaders.
- 35. Horse/pony/mini must be registered in both primary and secondary 4-H members' names with photo/Coggin's on file.
- 36. Members must attend minimum number of workouts as established by specialty area leader(s) to be able to show the shared animal at 4-H shows and/or St. Joseph County Grange Fair in Centreville, MI.

Horse Science: Department 69 - Sciences: Section E. Some awards are attached to the completion of this project that is judged and exhibited with the still projects.

English High Point Award Rules:

- A. The award will be for Grand and Reserve Champion English High Point. Members must participate in the Dressage and/or the Jumping programs and must show in at least one Jumping or Dressage class at the St. Joseph County Grange Fair.
- B. Points will be awarded from placing in English classes (all dressage classes, all jumping classes, all saddle seat pleasure classes, all saddle seat equitation classes, all hunter under saddle classes, all hunt seat equitation

- classes, all dressage suitability classes, all dressage seat equitation classes, all English pleasure classes, all English equitation classes, all English riding classes) at the Horse Council sponsored shows and/or at the St. Joseph County Grange Fair.
- C. Points will be awarded as follows: up to 6 placings for Horse Council sponsored shows and up to 8 placings at fair. Points are not pro-rated.
- D. In the case of a tie, the winner will be determined based on the highest total accumulated points in the jumping and dressage classes.
- E. May be won once per horse/rider combination.
- F. Walk/Trot classes are eligible for this award.

The Horse with the Most Heart Award Rules:

- A. Points are accumulated at Horse Council sponsored shows and/or fair based on the number of entries, one point per entry, up to six points at Horse Council sponsored shows and up to eight points at fair. Points are pro-rated.
- Tiebreaker is the horse and rider team with the most 1st places.
- C. Every 4-H speed event will count for points including gymkhana showmanship and gymkhana horsemanship, but points will be awarded in only one class per show. You may accumulate points for more than one horse/rider combination.
- D. First place can be won repeatedly, but only once with the same horse and rider combination.

Driving High Point Award Rules:

- A. Members must be enrolled and participate in the driving program and must show at the St. Joseph County Fair. Points for this award are accumulated at the St. Joseph County Fair only.
- B. Points will be awarded from the placings in the following five (5) classes: Working Pleasure, Reinsmanship, Drive & Showmanship, Driven Obstacle and highest Driven Dressage points. If a 4-H member is enrolled in more than one dressage class with the same horse, pony or miniature the points will be taken only from the highest placing.
- C. **Points will be pro-rated** by the number of participants in the class
- D. Exhibitors showing more than one equine will accumulate points on each animal or pair of animals separately; points are on a one-horse/one-driver basis or pair horses/one-driver basis.
- E. This award can be won repeatedly, but only once with the same horse/driver combination.
- F. In case of a tie: The winner will be determined by the exhibitor who beats the most drivers in Driving Reinsmanship. If the tie remains, then the exhibitor who beats the most drivers in working pleasure class will win the award. If a third breaker is required, the exhibitor who beats the most drivers in obstacles will win.

Megan Holt All Around Award

- A. Belt buckles: Buckles to be awarded to the overall Champion and Reserve Champion with the most points earned from 11 show bill classes at the St. Joseph County Fair and Horse Science.
- B. Based on the following show bill classes: showmanship, Western pleasure, English pleasure, bareback, trail, reining, poles, barrels, flags, keyhole, and speed and action.
- C. Walk/Trot classes do not count for this award.

- D. To be eligible for this award the exhibitor must attend and qualify in the gymkhana program and show a minimum of 9 show bill classes at the fair.
- E. Members that complete the Horse Science project at the fair will earn 10 points.
- F. Points are tabulated as follows: Eight points for first place, seven points for second place, six points for third place, five points for fourth place, four points for fifth place, three points for sixth place, two points for seventh place and one point for eighth place.
- G. Points will be counted regardless of the number of entries in the class. **Points are not pro-rated.**
- H. Points will be counted by the HC tabulation/point committee.
- Exhibitors showing more than one horse or pony will accumulate points on each animal separately.
- J. This award may be won multiple times but only once with the same horse/rider combination.
- K. Tiebreaker will be the fastest time in speed and action.
- L. The second tiebreaker will be the number of horses beaten in showmanship class.

Prairie Ponies High Point In-Hand Award Rules:

- A. The purpose of the award is to recognize excellence in four (4) in-hand miniature horse and pony classes in the St. Joseph County 4-H Horse Program project area.
- B. The award will be based on the performance of the team of one horse/pony and one handler. All horses/ponies must be 46" and under.
- C. A member may compete with more than one horse/pony combination. The winner will be the horse/pony and handler combination with the highest number of points. The award will not be granted to the same team two years in a row.
- D. This award is to be presented at the 4-H Horse awards event at the St Joseph County Grange Fair on the last weekend of the fair.
- E. The award is a Plaque stating the name of the award and \$50 to enhance the recipient's 4-H experience or toward horse related items/tack.
- F. The recipient will present their intentions to the 4-H Horse Council at a Horse Council meeting where the check will be presented to the recipient.
- G. Points will be accumulated from Horse Council sponsored shows and/or Fair Driving/In-Hand Show.
- H. The four (4) classes eligible for points are: in-hand hunter, in-hand jumping, in-hand trail and showmanship.
- I. Not all classes need to be entered to qualify.
- J. Points will be tabulated as stated and the number of entries in the class does not affect the outcome of points: up to 6 placings at Horse Council sponsored shows and 8 placings at fair. **Points are not pro-rated.**
- K. The Horse Council points committee will tabulate the points. If there is a tie, the In-Hand Jumper class at the fair will be the tie breaker.
- L. All participants' points will be tabulated.

St. Joseph County 4-H High Point Awards Rules:

- A. <u>Will be awarded for a Champion and Reserve Champion</u>, plus additional Top 3 (Top 5 total) in the following age groups: 13-19 and 8-12.
- B. Fair and/or Horse Council sponsored show classes are counted for this award. Top five (5) placings in the following classes per show will count for the award. Classes are bareback, Western horsemanship, hunt seat equitation, hunt seat pleasure, showmanship, saddle

- seat equitation, saddle seat pleasure, trail, Western pleasure, and Western/English riding.
- C. Points are tabulated as follows: up to 6 placings for Horse Council sponsored shows and up to 8 placings for fair. **Points are not pro-rated.**
- D. In the event of a tie, the committee will count the number of 1st places received. If a tie remains, 2nd place will be counted and so on.
- E. Points will be counted by the 4-H Horse Council tabulation/point committee. 4-H Horse Council President will confirm all tallied points.
- F. Walk/Trot classes do not count toward this award.

Walk/Trot Award

- A. An award will be given for Grand and Reserve Champion in each age division (8-12 and 13-19 years old) with the most points earned at <u>Horse Council sponsored shows</u> and/or the St. Joseph County Fair in the walk/trot classes.
- B. Classes eligible for points are: Western Horsemanship, Pleasure, English Equitation, English Pleasure, Bareback and Trail, English Dressage Test, Western Dressage Test
- C. Not all classes need to be entered to qualify.
- D. **Points are pro-rated based** upon the class size of those that compete in the class.
- E. Points will be counted by the Horse Council tabulation/point committee.
- F. Tie breaker will be the Walk/Trot Western Horsemanship class.
- G. Award may only be won once per rider/horse combination per age division.

In-Hand Gymkhana Award

- A. 4-H Youth must be enrolled in and participate in the inhand miniature horse/pony gymkhana classes at the St. Joseph County Fair.
- B. Points for this award are accumulated at the St. Joseph County Fair only.
- C. Every in-hand gymkhana speed class will count toward the award, excluding in-hand jumping and in-hand hunter.
- D. The purpose of this award is to recognize excellence in the in-hand miniature horse and pony classes of the St. Joseph County 4-H Horse Program project area.
- E. All miniature horses/ponies must be 46 inches and under.
- F. The award will be based on the performance of the team (project animal and youth), per age division.
- G. Youth may show more than one miniature horse/pony and will accumulate points on each animal separately.
- H. The award will be presented at the 4-H Horse Awards ceremony at the St. Joseph County Grange Fair or at an alternative scheduled place/time of Horse Council's choosing.
- I. Classes will be timed with placings per class based on fastest time with the least amount of errors/faults.
- J. Points will be awarded based on placing in all the in-hand miniature horse/pony gymkhana classes.
- K. Points will be tabulated as follows: eight points for first place, seven points for second place, six points for third place, five points for fourth place, four points for fifth place, three points for sixth place, two points for seventh place and one point for eighth place. Points are not pro-rated.
- L. In the case of a tie, the winner will be determined by the fastest time in the in-hand cloverleaf class.
- M. Award can only be won by horse/youth combination one time.

St. Joseph County Western High Point Award

- A. Award will be for Grand and Reserve Grand Champion.
- B. Points will be awarded based on placing in Bareback Horsemanship, Western Horsemanship, Western Pleasure, Reining, Ranchmanship, Ranch Pleasure, and all Western Dressage tests at the St. Joseph County Grange Fair.
- C. Not all classes need to be entered to qualify.
- D. Points will be tabulated as follows: eight points for first place, seven points for second place, six points for third place, five points for fourth place, four points for fifth place, three points for sixth place, two points for seventh place and one point for eighth place. Points are not pro-rated.
- E. In the case of a tie, the winner will be determined based on the highest total points in the dressage classes.
- F. Award may only be won once per rider/horse combination.
- G. Walk/Trot classes are eligible for this award.

Competitive Trail Award

- A. Exhibitor/Horse combination must attend at least two (2) qualifying trail rides before the official judged ride. See horse project rule book.
- B. Trail Ride is completed prior to fair, written test is completed at fair.
- C. Up to 8 placings will be awarded based on the overall ride. Points based on the competitive trail scoring requirements.
- D. In case of a tie, the winner will be determined by the horse with the lowest pulse & respiration.

Section A - Fitting & Showmanship (Placing premium table = 102)

- 1. **Attention:** If you choose to show a given 4-H project animal in **BOTH** a <u>Fitting & Showmanship</u> class and a <u>Horsemanship</u> class, the animal must be show in the <u>same type</u> of Fitting & Showmanship and Horsemanship classes (i.e., a horse shown in a Gymkhana Fitting & Showmanship class would need to be shown in the <u>corresponding</u> Gymkhana Horsemanship class, etc.)
- 2. **Attention:** To participate in a <u>Gymkhana Showmanship</u> class, horse/rider combination must compete in a <u>minimum</u> of three gymkhana performance classes.
- Only one (1) showmanship class will be allowed per horse/rider combination.
- 4. There will be a Grand & Reserve Grand Champion plus additional Top 3 (Top 5 total), exhibitors 13-19 and 8-12.

Section J - Gymkhana (A, B, C premium table = 2)

- Exhibitor must participate in a minimum of two approved workouts, and/or gymkhana coordinator approval will be required to participate in any gymkhana event at the fair.
- A breast collar <u>must</u> be used when exhibiting in this section.
- 3. **Horse/pony appointments:** All snaffle bits (including "O" rings "D" rings, egg butts), draw bits, gag bits, and hackamore combinations are acceptable in gymkhana classes.
- Exhibitor must show in at least three gymkhana classes at the St. Joseph County Fair on Saturday to be eligible to exhibit in gymkhana horsemanship and showmanship classes on Sunday.
- 5. A 5-second penalty will be assessed for knocking over a barrel, pole, cone or pattern marker.
- Speed and Action Class: Spinning to a stop more than 90 degrees in the box, as determined by the judge, may result in disqualification.
- While mounted, horse/pony may be led into the show area no more than one horse length past the gate in any class in this section.
- 8. The pattern that will be used for the flag race classes will be the Indiana flag race.
- Horse/riders will have one minute to enter the arena.
 Time starts when horse/rider is called.
- 10. Blindfolding a horse to get into the arena is not acceptable and will result in immediate disqualification.
- 11. The Champion and Reserve Champion will be determined with a run-off. The Run-off will be based on the top point earner at fair per age division, for horse and for pony (2 horse, 2 pony). The pattern will be Stakes Race on Even Years and Barrels/Cloverleaf on Odd Years.

Cats and Cat Care Sandy Summey, Superintendent

General Rules and Information

- A cat is a feline over one year of age as of the show date.
 A kitten is any feline four months to one year of age as of the show date.
- 2. Pregnant cats and kittens less than four months of age are ineligible to show.
- Exhibitors <u>will not</u> be allowed to enter an exhibit in this species department if exhibited at another county fair during the current year.
- For sections D & E exhibitor is NOT required to exhibit a feline for show.

Health Requirements

- Felines with infectious, contagious or toxicological disease may not be brought to the 4-H Cat Show (see leaders to learn requirements for receiving a "complete" for the project).
- 6. The exhibitor is responsible for documenting to their cat leaders that their feline(s) have received the required vaccinations:
 - Cats and Kittens: 3-in-1 vaccination and/or booster within past three years and receive their rabies booster within 12 months of the show or document

- from the veterinarian that the cat has received a three-year rabies vaccination within three years of the show date. Feline panleukopenia (distemper), rhinotracheitis and calci vaccinations (3-in-1) and booster 3 in 1 prior to the show.
- 7. If a licensed veterinarian did not administer vaccinations, the exhibitor must complete the 4-H Feline Vaccination Verification Form and submit it to their cat leader.

Fair Rules and Information

- 8. Feline must be brought to the fair in a well-ventilated carrier suitable for its size.
- 9. All cats must be removed from the fairgrounds upon completion of judging.
- 10. All cats must have their toenails clipped.
- 11. First-year exhibitors may show only one feline.
- 12. Second-year exhibitors may show one or two different felines. One entry per class.
- 13. Third-year and more advanced exhibitors may show up to four different felines. One entry per class.
- 14. The 4-H Cat Show date: **Thursday, September 11, 2025,** 6:00 p.m. in the Henningsen Show Arena, registration is 5:30 6:00 p.m.
- 15. Cat must be shown with collar/harness and leash, and must be under the control of the exhibitor at all times.
- 16. Cat judging criteria:
 - Animal: Eyes clear and moist; ears free of parasites and dirt; well groomed; shiny coat that is free of dirt, dandruff and parasites; clipped nails; strong straight limbs; appropriate weight. No penalty for de-clawing.
 - **Exhibitor:** Handles feline in proper, considerate manner.
