If you would like an opportunity to become involved with the development and guidance of the St. Joseph County 4-H Youth Program at the county level, then you will want to give serious consideration to running for election to the 4-H Youth Council! The election of 4-H leaders and members to fill 4-H Youth Council vacancies will take place in December, with newly elected members beginning their service on the Council at the January 6, 2025 4-H Youth Council re-organization meeting.

Eligibility: The eligibility requirements for running for election to the 4-H Youth Council are as follows:

- **Adult Representatives** - All 4-H leaders who were active leaders in 2024 are eligible to run for election to adult representative positions on the council.
- **Teen Representatives** - All 4-H members who will be 15-19 years old by January 1, 2025, who were active members during 2024, and who have completed a minimum of two (2) years in 4-H as of 2024 are eligible to run for election to 4-H teen representative positions.

The purposes of the Council are as follows:

- Provide a two-way communication link between local 4-H clubs and the 4-H Youth Educator.
- Provide counsel, guidance, and assistance to the 4-H Youth Program Coordinator in developing 4-H programs, events, and activities that meet the needs and interests of St. Joseph County youth and volunteer leaders.
- Provide financial support for the county 4-H Youth Program by way of fundraisers and secured donations.

Council Membership:

- Membership is open to all people without regard to race, color, national origin, gender, gender identity, religion, age, height, weight, disability, political beliefs, sexual orientation, marital status, family status or veteran status.

- The Council membership consists of 12 adult representatives and four (4) - six (6) teen representatives.
- Adult representatives must be active 4-H leaders at the time of the election, and during the time they hold office. Adult representatives serve two-year terms.
- Teen representative terms are only one (1) year in length in order to provide as many 4-H members as possible with the opportunity to develop leadership skills through service on the council.
- The following "seats" will be open in the 2025 4-H Youth Council election:
 - ❖ Six (6) adult representative seats
 - ❖ Six (6) teen representative seats

Council Meetings:

- Regular Council meetings are held the first Monday night (subject to change) of every month (starting in January) in the St. Joseph County MSU Extension Spartan room, 612 E. Main St., Centreville, Michigan. Meeting time is 6:30 p.m. Special meetings may be called whenever deemed necessary by the 4-H Program Coordinator and/or Council President. Council meetings are 1 ½ to 2 hours in length on average, but occasionally run longer depending on the number and/or scope of agenda items that need to be addressed.
- Please be aware that meeting attendance is ***VERY IMPORTANT!*** The 4-H Youth Council Constitution requires that the Council president meet with any Council representative who misses three meetings in a given project year to ask the representative to re-examine his/her commitment to serving on the council. Therefore, please be sure you are willing to make and keep a commitment to faithfully attend council meetings before you submit a self-nomination form!

Deadline for submitting your completed 4-H Youth Council Self-Nomination Form:

- Please complete and return the 4-H Youth Council ***Adult Representative Self-Nomination Form*** or ***Teen Representative Self-Nomination Form*** to the St. Joseph County MSU Extension office by ***Friday, November 8, 2024.***

I hope you will give running for election to the 4-H Youth Council serious consideration. Service on the council is an excellent leadership development opportunity for adults and teens alike!
