### PAR Report Kathryn Fitzpatrick

Happy 2025! I would like to send a special thank you to all past and present volunteers who have provided the labor of love and care to this special garden, and to encourage any new volunteers to check us out. The new year's resolutions for the garden are to improve our tools and beds with a focus on adaptability and accessibility, and to expand the diversity and quality of our yield to better support the community, our wonderful volunteers, and those in need.

Our review of 2024 led us to add more herbs as well as tomatillos, and to winterize the beds individually, so we can minimize weeds by selectively working with each bed. Seeds and seed potatoes have been ordered, and the necessary materials for starting alliums, cabbage, kohlrabi, peppers, herbs, tomatillos, and cucumbers will be ready for March/April, when we begin the season in the greenhouse.



The start of the season in the garden is usually wet, dirty, and often cold, so we will need hearty individuals to help eradicate the weeds that may have survived, add compost/soil to the beds as needed, maintain the irrigation lines and parts, and lay mulch in the pathways. Any beds that were not covered or lost their covers over the winter will need to be weeded, cultivated, and leveled for planting.

We are counting on all the gardeners who are anxious to get back into the garden – the PAR garden will be calling!

We are looking forward to another great season in 2025, as well as to welcoming new volunteers who are interested in joining our fantastic team and providing such a valuable service to the community. We have an enthusiastic, fun, hard-working team, and plenty of rewarding opportunities to help those in need.



Join us for Maple Fest 2025 (March 8th and 9th), an exciting celebration of Michigan's sweetest winter crop—maple syrup! Discover the fascinating journey of how sap transforms into syrup as we guide you through the tapping process. First, identify a healthy sugar maple tree, typically with a trunk diameter of at least 10 inches, and with the right temperatures—days above freezing and nights below—sap begins to flow.

Experience the traditional method of tapping by drilling a small hole and inserting a spike, allowing the sweet sap to drip into buckets. Afterward, take a tour of our historic sugar shack to see the boiling process and the tools used in the age-old craft. Enjoy hands-on activities like wagon rides and sampling fresh maple sap, syrup, and sugar.

Come hungry for our 'all-you-can-eat' pancake celebration in the beautiful 19th-century barn, where you can indulge in pancakes, sausage, and of course, pure maple syrup! Embrace the spirit of spring and the rich flavors of maple at this delightful festivity!


