Garden to Table Summer Workshop Series

In this hands-on program, youth will explore the journey of food from seed to plate! Participants will learn how to plant and care for a garden, harvest fresh produce, and turn their homegrown ingredients into simple, healthy meals. Activities promote teamwork, environmental awareness, and healthy living through fun and engaging gardening and cooking experiences.

- 6/20, 2-3:30pm: Plant it, grow it, eat it! Youth will learn the basics of gardening, including how to start seeds, transplant seedlings, and care for plants. Participants will create their own mini container gardens to take home, using herbs or veggies that are easy to grow.

Wayne County 4-H Fun Corner: Parfait-ly Simple Recipe of the Month

Materials Needed:

- Cutting boards
- Plastic knives
- Plastic cup or bowl
- Measuring cups and spoons

<u>Ingredients (Includes, but not limited to):</u>

- Yogurt (plain or flavored)
- Granola
- Mixed fresh fruit (bananas, strawberries, blueberries, etc.)
- Honey (optional)
- Chocolate chips

Steps

- Step 1: Wash and prepare fruit (demonstrate proper washing).
- Step 2: Safely cut fruit into small pieces.
- Step 3: Layer yogurt, fruit, chocolate chips, and granola in a cup or bowl.
- **Step 4:** Drizzle honey if desired and enjoy!





4-H Success Stories

4-H STEM-Tastic Spring Break Day Camp!

The 2025 4-H STEM-Tastic Spring Break Day Camp offered an exciting day of hands-on learning for 19 youth in grades 4–8. Held at Jefferson Barns Community Vitality Center in Westland, the free camp focused on engaging youth in science, technology, engineering, and math (STEM) through interactive activities designed to spark curiosity and build real-world skills. Thanks to the generous support of Jefferson Barns, the camp also included lunch for all participants and instructors, helping eliminate barriers related to childcare and meals for families in the Wayne-Westland community.

Throughout the day, youth participated in a variety of activities that connected STEM concepts to everyday experiences. They explored electrical conductivity by designing light-up greeting cards with paper circuits and learned about emulsions and physical changes while making homemade butter. During the outdoor environmental science sessions, participants dissected real owl pellets to study predator-prey relationships and created homemade bird feeders to support local wildlife.

A budgeting activity using M&Ms introduced financial literacy in a fun and accessible way, helping youth understand how to manage income, expenses, and savings. The AgBot challenge encouraged critical thinking around agricultural technology and robotics, while the final activity—creating mindfulness jars—combined science with self-care as youth learned about liquid density and sensory regulation.

The camp also provided leadership development opportunities for two teen leaders who assisted with programming and served as role models for younger participants. They helped guide activities, offered encouragement, and gained valuable experience in mentoring and youth engagement.

By the end of the day, participants left with increased STEM knowledge, improved problem-solving skills, and a deeper appreciation for science in everyday life. The camp successfully combined learning, creativity, and leadership, offering a meaningful experience for all involved.


Meet the new 4-H Program Assistant – Marc Peeples!

Wayne County 4-H is proud to welcome Marc Peeples as our new 4-H Program Assistant, focused on delivering agriculture education across the county. Known throughout the community as *Brother Truth*, Marc brings a wealth of experience and passion for urban farming, youth empowerment, and food justice.

Born and raised in Detroit, Marc is the co-founder of Liberated Farms and the Pyramid Builders Institute of S.T.E.A.M., both deeply rooted in the neighborhood where he grew up. He is also a member of the Detroit Food Policy Council, working at the intersection of community, food access, and education. Marc gained attention as a survivor of the viral #GardeningWhileBlack incident, using that moment to fuel a movement. His mission is clear: to combat food apartheid by equipping youth with the skills and education to transform their communities.

Through Liberated Farms, Marc offers innovative youth programs like the Youth Farmer Apprentice Program, Free Coding and Computer Programming Classes, a Rites of Passage Program for young boys, and the powerful Feedom Freedom Bags initiative—which provides 5 pounds of fresh produce monthly to each household in the community.

Marc's energy and vision are a perfect fit for 4-H, and we're excited to see the impact he'll make here in Wayne County. Join us in giving a warm welcome to Marc!

Michigan 4-H license plate now available!

Michigan drivers have a new way to show their 4-H pride while supporting 4-H youth development programming: through the purchase of the newly released <u>Michigan 4-H</u> license plate. Available at the Michigan Secretary of State, the plate prominently displays the signature 4-H clover and part of the proceeds from every sale and renewal will go to support Michigan 4-H youth.

"We are elated that the Michigan 4-H license plate is officially here," said Quentin Tyler, director of Michigan State University Extension, which is home to the Michigan 4-H program. "We hope the many members of our Michigan 4-H community –youth, parents, alumni and supporters – will consider supporting 4-H by purchasing a plate as they renew their licenses this year."



Similar to other special cause fundraising license plates in the state, the Michigan 4-H license plate will cost \$35, with \$25 of the purchase fee benefiting Michigan 4-H Youth Development. A \$10 fee will also be charged to benefit Michigan 4-H when the plate is renewed. License plates may be ordered by visiting Michigan.gov/sos, by mailing in a form or scheduling a visit to any Secretary of State office. The plate will be delivered by mail in two to three weeks.

Michigan 4-H Foundation opens 2024-25 grant cycle

Awarded annually, the Michigan 4-H Foundation recently opened their grant and award opportunities for the 2025-2026 season. Open to 4-H volunteer leaders, members and staff, the grants and awards support local 4-H clubs and county programs. **All applications are due June 1.**

"County 4-H programs and clubs have so many unique programs," said Abbey Miller, director of the Michigan 4-H Foundation. "Thanks to the support of our generous 4-H donor community, we are pleased to offer mini-grants to support these many wonderful programs."



Opportunities include:

- **Michigan 4-H Legacy Grants of \$1,000.** These grants are awarded to support development of a new program or initiative or to strengthen, enhance or expand a current program that is making a difference.
- **4-H On-Target Grants of \$500.** These grants support 4-H Shooting Sports programs to enhance existing programs, develop a new program or offer a special experience related to 4-H Shooting Sports.
- The Collins 4-H Youth Horticulture Grant of \$500. This grant is available only to 4-H youth clubs and supports advancement of club work in plant science and horticulture activities.
- **4-H Educational Garden Grants of \$1,000.** These grants support the creation of local 4-H educational gardens in Michigan.
